Collection publication”**

(TALLAHASSEE) - The John G. Riley Center/Museum will host a book unveiling for another Riley Signature Collection titled “The Proctors – Roots, Branches, Voices” on **Saturday, November 3rd, 2018** from **11:00 to 1:00 P.M.** This special unveiling, community engagement and listening history experience, will take place 419 East Jefferson St. Tallahassee, FL 32301.

The history of a prominent Florida African American family: Antonio, George, John and Bahamia. A seldom spoken phenomenon of slavery family separations is explored and presented as part of the little heretofore unknown history that is contained in the publication.
